Do you work in a Major trauma centre? Are you ready to deal with a marauding terrorist attack? It is likely that within the next 2 years it will become mandatory for paediatric surgeons working in a Major Trauma Centre to have completed a surgical skills trauma course (more than just ATLS/APLS).
