1. Richard Stewart welcomed everyone and asked for thoughts and feedback from the Liverpool Congress?

There was uniform agreement that it was beneficial to attend congress encouraging greater exposure of the charities to surgeons. The selection of which charities to invite will require careful consideration, All were enthusiastic to be involved again in 2019.

- 2. The group then discussed options for involvement at this year's congress in Nottingham.
 - Wednesday am session
 - Charity Board meeting
 - 'Transition of care from Paediatric to Adult services'
 - a. Wednesday am -A 90 minute joint session was proposed (11:00-12:30pm) giving charities/BAPS an opportunity to inform each other of their roles and to explore how they could mutually benefit from collaborating together. The audience (max 60) could compromise consultants, trainees and parents (invited by the charities). A request was made for a 'catchy title' to publicise the session. Would it be helpful to have a high profile chair eg the Earl of Listowel, House of Lords?

BAPS could present on:

- ⇒ BAPS functions Membership/Units
- ⇒ Results of 2018 Charity survey
- ⇒ Research
- ⇒ International work
- ⇒ Website parents area
- ⇒ Patient information

Areas for roundtable discussion:

- ⇒ How surgeons engage with charities and patients groups
- ⇒ Identification of a "bona fide" charity
- ⇒ Multidisciplinary team working eg with neonatal, feto-maternal, genetics
- ⇒ Organisational themes
- ⇒ Fundraising
- b. Charity Board meeting- for discussion and planning of future collaboration at a convenient time during the congress.
- c. 'Transition of care from Paediatric to Adult services' -BAPS are planning a 60 minute session on Friday the 5th of July to discuss NICE guidance inviting a Royal College of Surgeons Council member to speak from his adult perspective. It was proposed that this was an opportunity for the charities to give a short presentation from their perspective. The draft format is for four 15 minute blocks Charities NICE RCS Roundtable discussion. This would allow for three 5min or four 31/2 min presentations from patient charities.
